

**MINUTES

OF THE JURUPA VALLEY CITY COUNCIL
May 30, 2012**

1. 7:00 P.M. - CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL FOR BUDGET WORKSHOP

Mayor Roughton called the Budget Workshop to order at 7:09 p.m. All Council Members were present.

2. DISCUSSION OF FISCAL YEAR 2012-13 ANNUAL CITY BUDGET

Susan Mahoney, Administrative Services Director, reviewed the proposed 2012-13 Fiscal Year Annual Budget and responded to Council's questions.

Mayor Roughton called the Regular Session to order at 8:05 p.m.

4. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE was led by Mayor Roughton.

5. INTRODUCTIONS, ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS, PRELIMINARY CITY COUNCIL COMMENTS

Mayor Roughton reported on her attendance at the UCR Citizens University Committee breakfast meeting which featured Chancellor Timothy P. White. Chancellor White gave an uplifting speech regarding UCR's budget issues, noting that UCR did not give up on the creation of their medical school despite significant challenges. She noted that his words were

very inspiring and gives her hope that by staying focused and working together, the SB 1566 issue will ultimately be resolved.

Council Member Goodland discussed his desire to encourage business to come into the city and his belief that new taxes would be a last resort.

6. PUBLIC APPEARANCE/COMMENTS

Sheila Ehrlich discussed the proposed budget for Riverside County animal services, suggesting that the County may be willing to negotiate the costs.

Betty Anderson suggested that the Jurupa Community Services District may be willing to offer their services to the City of Jurupa Valley. She discussed the Jurupa Valley Sheriff's substation, noting other nearby communities utilize the substation and they could be charged rent. Another option would be for the City to sell the substation back to the County.

Don Davies discussed the efforts it took to become a city and the importance of city revenue sources. He believes the revenue neutrality agreement with the County of Riverside should be null and void as the previous estimates are no longer accurate. He urged the Council to create new revenue sources and help drive up business in the community to ensure tax dollars stay in the city. He encouraged citizens to shop Jurupa Valley first and to visit the website: www.shopjurupavalleyfirst.com.

Tom Searles discussed his efforts to expand his business, noting he is concerned about what has been transpiring regarding City staff's efforts to go through certain bureaucratic processes. He suggested that businesses could help pay their way to help solve the City's revenue shortfall. He encouraged the Council to work with business and not against them.

7. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

A motion was made by Mayor Pro Tem Lauritzen, seconded by Council Member Johnston, to approve the Agenda.

8. COUNCIL BUSINESS

A. ADOPTION OF THE FISCAL YEAR 2012-13 ANNUAL CITY BUDGET

Following discussion, the City Council directed that the budget be brought back to the June 21, 2012 Council meeting for further discussion and due to the economic uncertainties related to Senate Bill 1566, to bring back a revised budget that reflects the loss of the vehicle license fee revenue.

9. FURTHER COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS AND COMMENTS

Council Member Johnston proposed the formation of an ad hoc Committee to discuss various options for a banner program that would honor and recognize Jurupa Valley's military personnel. He suggested that the first military banner could be unveiled on the July 4th weekend.


Council Member Goodland requested that an item be placed on the next Agenda to consider changing the Council meeting times from Thursdays to Tuesdays.
